



# Country Profile Austria

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# 1. Country Overview

Strategically located at the geographical heart of Europe on the key Danube trade route, Austria is one of the most prosperous and stable EU Member States. It is characterised by a well-developed market economy, skilled labour force, and high standard of living, and is closely tied to other EU economies, especially Germany's.

With a population of around 8.5 million people, Gross Domestic Product (GDP ) per capita for 2012 stood at EUR 36,640 (2012 nominal) [2011: EUR 35,710], putting Austria under the top three within the 27 EU countries (behind Luxembourg and the Netherlands) as well as world-wide with a well-developed market, low unemployment and a high standard of living.

The evolution of GDP at current prices and the real change in GDP growth from 2005 to 2012 is provided in the table below:

According to the recent economic outlook for Austria by the “Oesterreichische Nationalbank”, OeNB (7.6.2013) a significant economic recovery is slow in coming. It revised its forecast from December 2012. For 2013 and 2014 revised real GDP growth of 0.3% and 1.5% respectively are expected. This means a downward revision by 0.2%. Only in 2015 the Austrian economy will grow again on average by 1.8% in the long-term. Compared to 2.0% in 2013, inflation in subsequent years will move just below 2% (2014: 1.7% 2015: 1.8%).

## 2. Sectorial Overview

### 2.1 The Industry

Austria is a highly developed industrialised country with the foremost industries being foodstuffs and luxury commodities, mechanical engineering and steel construction, chemicals and vehicle manufacturing. The country has deposits of iron ore, non-ferrous metals, and important minerals. It also has its own resources of petroleum and natural gas. The generation of hydroelectric power is constantly being expanded, making Austria the number one country in this sector of energy generation in the European Union.

Although some industries are global competitors, Austria's industrial and commercial sectors are characterised by a high proportion of medium-sized companies. The industrial sector comprise about 55,000 enterprises engaged in construction, machinery, vehicles and parts, food, metals, chemicals, lumber and wood processing, paper and paperboard, communications equipment, tourism. As a whole, these traditional pillars of the national economy employ more than 900,000 people and generate a yearly turnover of about EUR 180 billion.

The most important industrial sectors in Austria are:

- Mechanical and Steel Engineering
- Chemical and Automotive industry
- Electrics and Electronics industry and
- Wood, Pulp and Paper industry.
- Food and Drink industry

The majority of Austrian goods exports come from these industrial sectors.

## 2.2 Agriculture and Forestry

The agricultural sector presently contributes 2% to the country's GDP and employs around 6% of its active population. Cattle breeding and wine growing are the main agricultural activities; with organic agriculture developing rapidly. Austria has about 19,000 eco-farms adding to the country's reputation as Europe's deli shop.

47% of Austria is forested (and grows yearly by 5100 ha). Besides water, wood plays a more and more important role as a renewable source of energy. The share in the Austrian national economy made up by the agricultural use of land amounts to 56%, arable farming accounts for 18%, while forestry makes up 44%.

## 2.3 Services

Tourism is an essential pillar of the Austrian economy. Being a mountainous country with one of the largest unspoilt natural land reserves in Central Europe, it attracts a large number of tourists. For 2012, arrivals rose by 4.4% and reached an all-time-high of 36.2 million. There was a rise in overnight stays by 4% to 131.0 million. The overnight stays of resident visitors increased by 1.9% and reached 36.0 million, whereas the overnight stays of non-resident visitors increased by 4.8% and reached 95.1 million.

Apart from tourism, Austria's service sector also encompasses finance and consulting, banking, public services, commerce and transportation. The services sector accounts for two thirds of the Gross Domestic Product.

## 2.4 Research & Development (R&D)

According to Statistics Austria, €8.6 billion were spent on Research and Development (R&D) in the year 2012. This corresponds to a research intensity of 2.80%, which is calculated as R&D expenditure in relation to the gross domestic product.

According to an estimate of Statistics Austria presumably €8.96 billion will be spent on research and experimental development (R&D) in 2013. In comparison to 2012, the total sum of Austrian R&D expenditure will increase by 2.9% and hence reach 2.81% of the gross domestic product (GDP).

The largest part of total R&D expenditure 2013 (around 43.9% or €3.93 billion) will be financed by businesses. The public sector will contribute 40.4%. 15.2% will be financed from abroad and 0.5% (approximately €49 million) by the private non-profit sector.

## 3. Foreign Trade

In 2012, imports as well as exports rose slightly. Austrian imports of goods increased by 0.7% to €131.96 bn, Austrian exports rose by 1.4% to €123.47 bn. This growth derived from trade with third-countries (arrivals: +4.3 % to €39.05 bn; dispatches: +6.5 % to €39.33 bn). Trade with EU member states slightly decreased (import: -0.7 % to €92.91 bn; export: -0.8 per cent to €84.14 bn). The Austrian trading balance of trade deficit amounted to €8.49 bn while in 2011 the balance showed a deficit of €9.23 bn.

### Trade with EU-27

Austria's economy is dependent on foreign trade and is closely linked to the economies of other EU countries, particularly Germany.

Overall, trade with the EU member states accounted for 70.4% of total imports (2011: 71.4%) and 68.1% of total exports (2011: 69.7%). In 2012 as a whole, imports of goods from the 26 EU partner countries fell by 0.7 % to €92.91 bn. Exports of goods to these countries decreased by

0.8% to €84.14 bn. Compared to the previous year, the deficit in trade with the EU rose from €8.72 bn to €8.77 bn.

Exports to Austria's most important trading partners, Germany and Italy, slowed down significantly in 2012. Austria recorded a trade deficit of €47 million in February 2013. The major export commodity in Austria is the automobile and its components, machinery and paper products. Austria imports mainly machinery and equipment, motor vehicles, chemicals, metal goods, oil and oil products and foodstuffs. Austria's main import partners are the EU Countries: Germany, Italy and the Netherlands, as well as Switzerland, China and the USA

#### **Trade with non-EU countries:**

The value of imports to non-EU countries increased by 4.3% to €39.05 bn. Exports also rose by 6.5 % to €39.33 bn. The balance of trade with non-EU countries turned into a surplus of €0.28 bn.

In value terms, the most important commodities traded with non-EU countries were machinery and transport equipment (imports: +6.7% to €10.50 bn; exports: +7.4% to €17.33 bn). Trade with manufactured goods showed a decrease by 3.9% to €3.56 bn (imports) and an increase by 2.8% to €7.85 bn (exports).

From above table, Austria imports a total of USD 2.9 billion from Africa, including island in the Indian and Antarctic oceans such as British Indian Oceans Territories, French South Antarctic Territories, Saint Helena and Cape Verde. The main African importing partners of Austria are Nigeria, Libya, Algeria and South Africa.

Austria imported from Mauritius for a total value of USD 13.9 million in 2012.

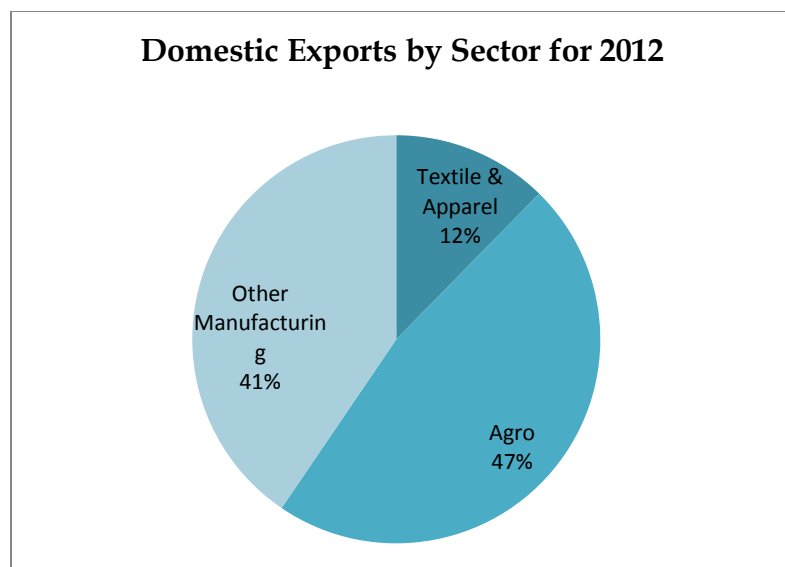

From the above table, it can be observed that there has been a parallel increase in both domestic exports and total exports during the period 2007-2012, except in 2010 where domestic exports and total exports fell by 0.4% and 0.7% respectively; and 2012 where both domestic exports and total exports registered negative growth of 6.7% and 3.2% respectively.

Agro and other manufacturing constituted the bulk of domestic exports in 2012, with 47% and 41% respectively. Textile and Apparel accounted only for 12% of domestic exports.
